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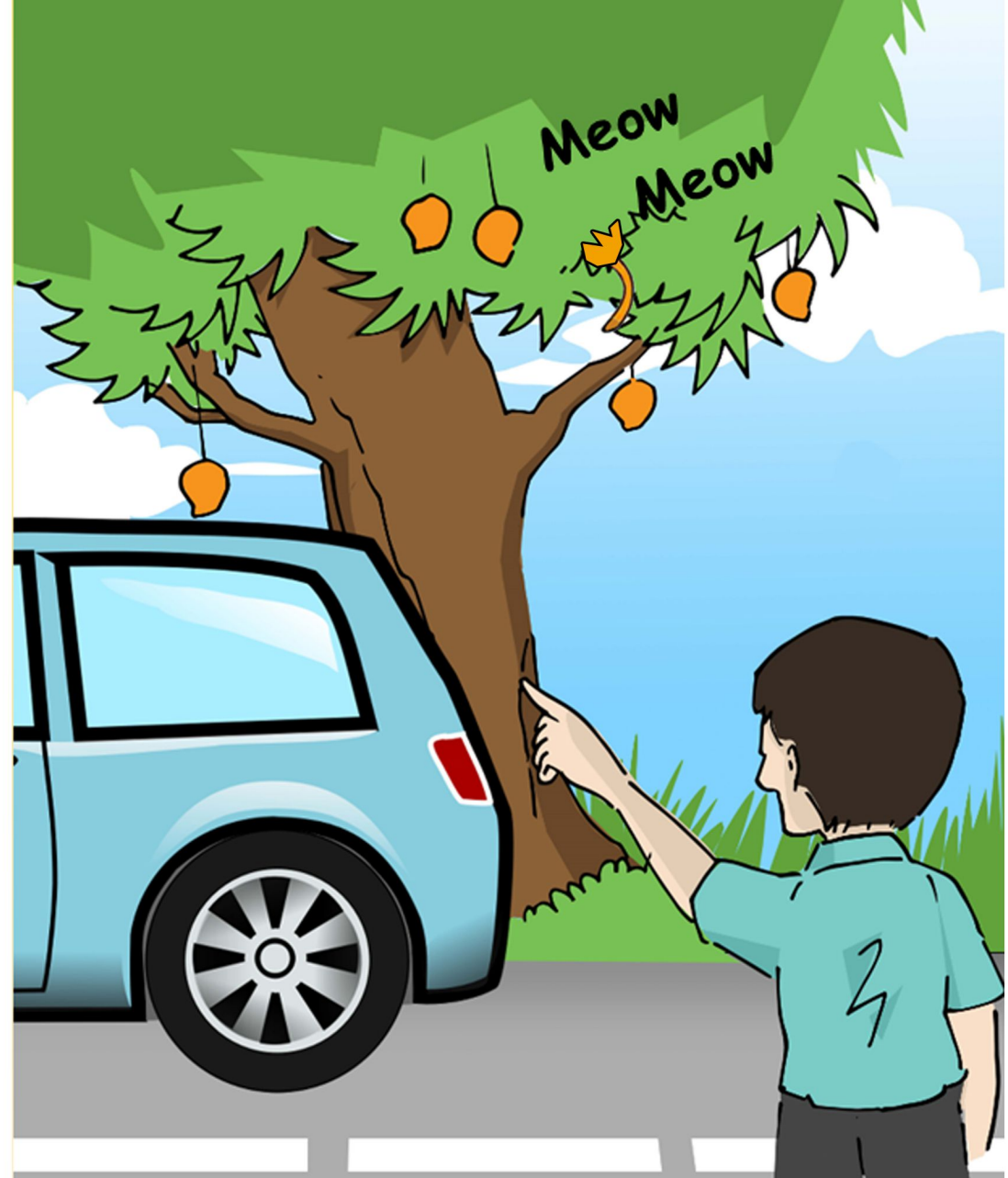
One day, when he was away at school, someone had left his front door open, and Goldie went missing.

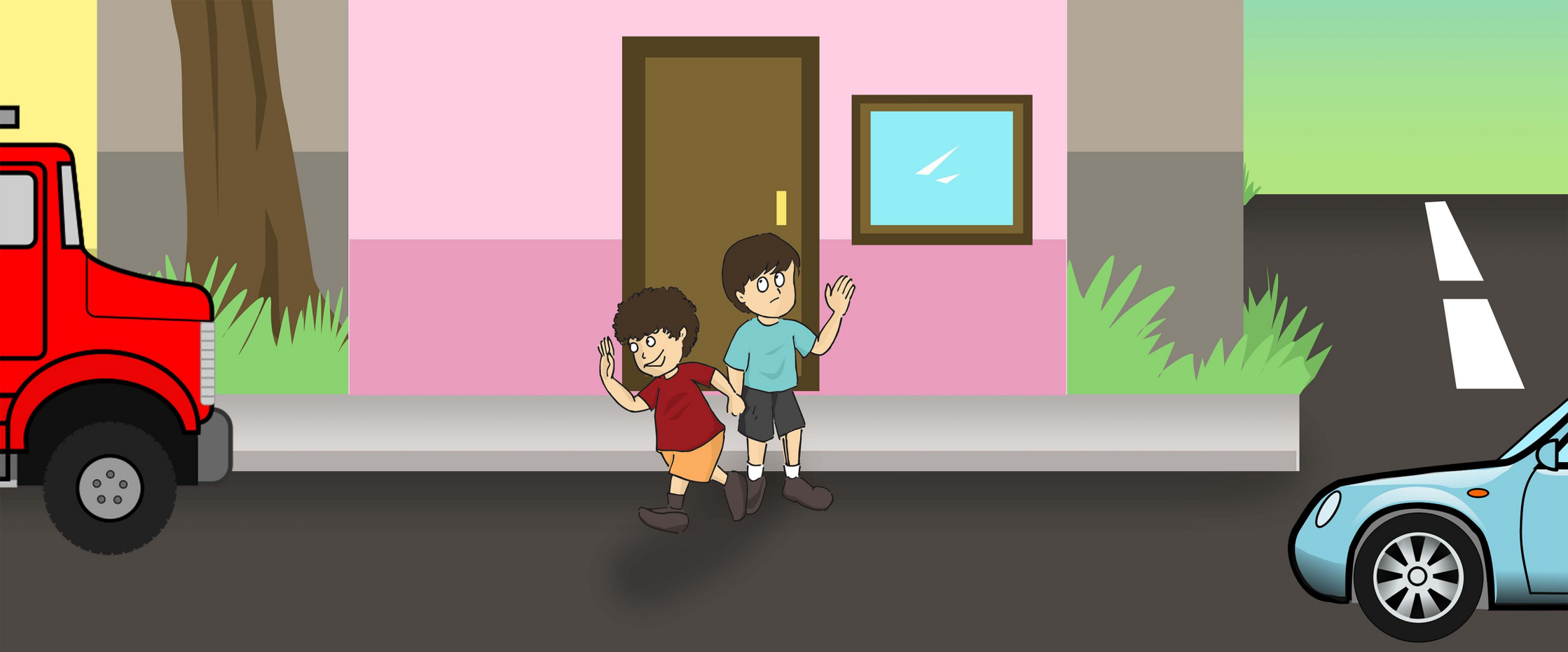

Although a little nervous, he held tightly onto Goldie and crossed the road to go home.

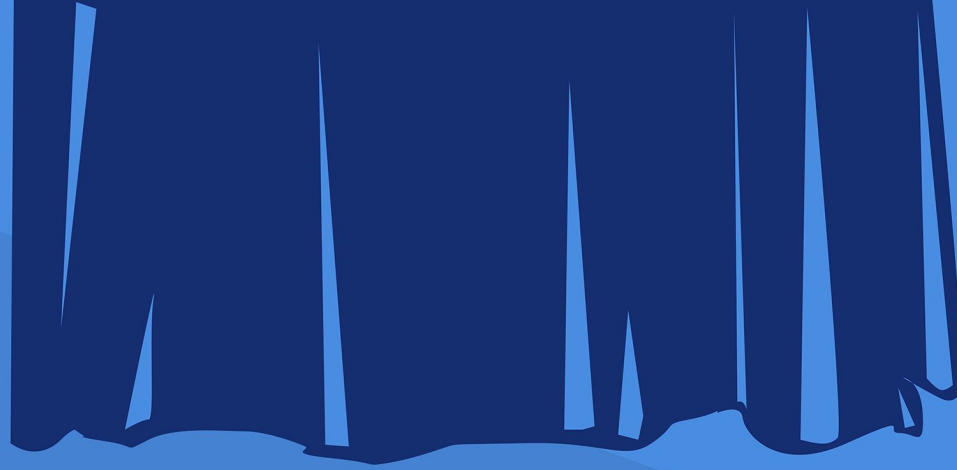


Later that night, Raju told his mother what had happened. "I felt bad that I could not cross the road...and so I was scared, Amma," Raju said.
