







Once upon a time there was a rabbit called Mimi. She lived with her mother and father in a little house at the corner of the forest.








She also liked watching her cook in the kitchen and following her around as she cleaned the house. She loved her mother very much. Mimi did not see her father very much as he was not often at home.



"I want my mummy...no one but mummy...bring her back!" wept Mimi.








Some days later, Mimi's father took her to the market.
