
## Mimi Finds a New Home





At last they arrived at a large house with a tall green door and with a white fence around it.




It was opened by a round, fat, smiling bear who said, "Hello, I am Mrs.Bear...

"You must have been so frightened and so sad...all little animals feel afraid and upset when their mummies and daddies go away or leave them."


"But I am so glad you found us...you are safe now. First let us get you something to eat and then you can meet all the other little animals before you go to bed," said Mrs. Bear.




After Mr. Fox left Mrs. Bear took Mimi to the kitchen.




Actually, it tasted quite nice, thought Mimi later on.




After Mimi had eaten, Mrs. Bear took her to a room filled with other little animals. Mimi had never seen so many of them together before...and she felt a bit nervous!









And Sheru the tiger cub, who was naughty, and pulled other animals' tails (at least those who had tails!)...








They liked to make funny faces and get people to laugh.
