


After some days, Mimi slowly became used to her new home. She now knew all the rooms in the house...which one to eat in, where to sleep and where the school room was.

She was shy and scared at first but soon joined in the others' games.


She played 'catch' with Nanu; hide-and-seek with Kiki, Sheru and Bobo; and running races with Monty and Bunty.

She loved to climb the mango tree with Momo to pick mangoes even while they were raw, although Mrs. Deer pleaded with them to allow the fruit to ripen!





And how to count and colour.






And about animals who lived in the nearby mountains.

She showed them how to do excercises every morning, to make them strong and healthy.






The best thing about her was that she never hit or shouted at anyone, not even at Sheru when he broke a toy or at Momo when he spilled the paint on the floor.
